

ASSISTANT PROFESSOR – ORGANIC CHEMISTRY

The Department of Chemistry & Biochemistry (<http://www.uncw.edu/chem>) at the University of North Carolina Wilmington invites applications for a tenure-track faculty position in organic chemistry at the assistant professor level starting January 2013. The successful candidate is expected to develop excellence in teaching, including introductory and advanced organic chemistry courses, both at the undergraduate and graduate levels, and to maintain a vigorous, externally funded research program involving undergraduate and master's students. A PhD in an area of chemistry, postdoctoral experience, and a record of research in organic chemistry or a related field are required. The Department is well-equipped with state-of-the-art instrumentation, which includes 400 MHz and 600 MHz NMR instruments (managed by a full-time PhD scientist) and LC/MSⁿ and HR-LC/MS systems.
