Program handouts for your licensure area are available on the Watson School of Education's website: <http://www.uncw.edu/ed/degrees.html> These program handouts have important information on prerequisites, course sequencing, internship requirements, etc. ***Secondary Education methods courses are fall only, and student teaching/ internship is spring only.*** (PE and Music internships are fall or spring.) **Please review these handouts carefully to ensure that you have accurate information on requirements and course sequences.**

If you have not been admitted to the Teacher Education Program in the Watson School of Education, the admissions requirements are listed below:

1. Completion of the University requirements in English, mathematics, and a science laboratory course with a grade of "C" or better.
2. Completion of Education 200, [Teacher, School and Society](#), with a grade of "C" or better.
3. Completion of four semesters or two academic years of full-time college study or completion of required general studies with a minimum grade point average of 2.7 on a 4.0 scale on all work attempted at UNCW. Transfer students must earn a 2.7 on a minimum of 12 hours completed at UNCW.
4. Passing scores on teacher education entry tests specified and mandated by the Board of Education of the State of North Carolina. [To sign up for the computerized version of Praxis I offered in Westside Hall, call 962-7444 for an appointment.](#)
PPST Reading = 176 PPST Writing = 173 PPST Mathematics = 173
UNCW must be listed as a score recipient.

[SAT scores can now be used in lieu of Praxis I if the scores meet a certain criteria.](#) For more information, see: <http://www.uncw.edu/ed/advising/sat.html>

Students must be admitted to the Watson School to be enrolled in EDN courses numbered higher than EDN 303. For admission at the end of the fall semester, applications are due by December 1st; students must take Praxis I by November 15th in order for scores to be received in time. **Official passing scores for all three PRAXIS sections must be received by the application deadline indicated in order to be admitted.** Praxis registration materials and study information are available on the website: www.ets.org/praxis/ Applications to the Watson School of Education are available online at www.uncw.edu/ed/advising

NOTE: Students who have previously applied but were not admitted **must reapply** for admission.

Any students enrolling in EDN courses beyond EDN 303 ***must be admitted*** to the Watson School of Education. Students can preregister for courses pending admission, but those who have not been admitted by the beginning of the semester **will be dropped** from the courses for which they are not eligible (i.e., EDN courses above EDN 303).
