**Each of these questions should be answered on separate sheets of paper. Please answer each bullet point individually.**

- Other than the assumed “love of children” that education students have, please write a 2-3 paragraph statement as to *WHY* you want to be a teacher and describe your career objectives.
- Brief statement (1-2 paragraphs) about your academic objectives and the academic challenges you face.
- List of your scholastic achievements (Dean’s list, degrees earned, honor societies).
- Briefly (2 paragraphs) describe how receiving a scholarship will assist you in meeting your financial needs, and why you need/deserve a scholarship.
- Two letters of reference (one must be from a UNCW faculty member who can attest to your academic performance). These letters must be included in your final packet, and should not be submitted separately.
- Autobiography: Oftentimes, scholarship donors want to know about the students they are assisting. Please include a 1 page (minimum) typed autobiography. You can include goals, past experiences, challenges, family information, anything you think applicable that will provide insights to reviewers and donors.
  1. The autobiography will be provided to the donors of any scholarships you receive (with your written permission only – see #3 below).
  2. Please be sure to include your name in the autobiography.
  3. Release forms will be provided for scholarship recipients to sign and date. This signature will serve as permission for releasing names and biographical information for donor relations.

**General Information for Applicants:**

- A listing of available WSE scholarships is available in the UNCW catalogue and at <http://www.uncw.edu/catalogue/documents/catalogue.pdf>. The scholarship list was accurate when published. Please be aware, however, that the funding situation may change for some scholarships and new scholarships may become available.
- Applicants do not select which scholarships they wish to apply for; instead, the Scholarship Committee will consider applicants for all eligible scholarships.
- Any UNCW student in good academic standing who meets the following criteria may apply for a scholarship:
  - Applicant must be enrolled in a degree or licensure program in the WSE. Students must be admitted into the WSE by the application deadline.
  - Applicant must have a current UNCW GPA. Students in their first semester at UNCW are not eligible for scholarships, as all scholarships require a current and cumulative GPA.
- Please be patient! Your application materials will be reviewed by the WSE Scholarship Committee. This process takes time.
- Scholarship decisions are ordinarily announced in late May/ early June. All applicants will be notified via letter (to the address listed on this application) and via UNCW email.
