

## B.S. Nursing RN Access Option: RN-BS

The University of North Carolina Wilmington, Onslow Extension Program, in partnership with the North Carolina Community College System, offers a Bachelor of Science in Nursing (NSG) that can be completed entirely in Jacksonville, NC.

Online and face-to-face courses are available and offered in Jacksonville at Coastal Carolina Community College and at the John A. Lejeune Education Center aboard Camp Lejeune. Area residents, military, and military dependents have access to these courses.

### Career Opportunities in Nursing

The UNCW School of Nursing (SON) RN-BS Option allows the working RN, at the associate degree or diploma level, to obtain a Bachelor of Science degree with a Concentration in Professional Nursing in an online format.

### UNCW Application Information

- Prospective students must meet criteria for admission to UNCW and must apply through the normal application process. View the admissions website [www.uncw.edu/admissions](http://www.uncw.edu/admissions) for details.
- Students may transfer a maximum of 64 semester hour credits from two-year institutions or a maximum of 93 semester credit hours from four-year institutions.
- Students admitted to UNCW Extension degree programs, as extension transfer students, must have completed a minimum of 24 college credits (from any college in the North Carolina Community College System or other accredited institutions).
- Application deadline is March 1 for Summer and Fall classes and November 1 for Spring classes.

### UNCW School of Nursing Application Information

Nursing core courses require a minimum of one academic year of full-time study. Two or more years of part-time study is necessary to complete the required nursing major courses.

- In addition to admission to UNCW, School of Nursing admissions requirements include:
  - A minimum GPA of 2.5 calculated over all college course work. A current unrestricted license to practice as a RN in North Carolina or one of the states participating in the Nurse Licensure Compact. This requirement must be met prior to the enrollment in the first clinical course (NSG 405: Community Health Nursing).
  - Minimum 40 credit hours of the required prerequisite non-nursing course requirement must be completed prior to admission to RN-BS option
    - Must complete Anatomy and Physiology I & II, Microbiology, General Psychology, General Chemistry, College Algebra, & 6 credits of college English
  - The core degree courses only are online. If a student does not have sufficient or applicable courses completed at the time of transfer to fulfill all UNCW Basic Studies and collateral degree requirements then those may have to be completed through traditional classroom-based courses. If you need assistance determining how your courses will transfer to UNCW and what requirements they will fulfill please contact the Office of Admissions and ask to speak with a transfer counselor (910-962-3243). If you have questions regarding the RN to BSN or please contact the School of Nursing and ask to speak with the directors for these programs (910-962-3784).
