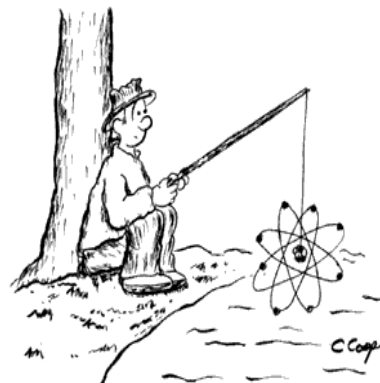
### Summer Humor
