Admission Criteria to the RN to BSN Program:

To be admitted to the program, students must satisfy the following admission prerequisites:

- A GPA of 2.5 calculated over all college coursework. Each student's total GPA is calculated on all transferable college courses attempted at all accredited institutions of higher education according to the guidelines in use by the UNCW Admissions Office.
- Documentation of Physical, mental, and emotional health that enables a student to participate in and complete the program
- Current unencumbered license as a Registered Nurse in North Carolina or the state in which you will do your clinical coursework. This requirement must be met prior to the enrollment in the first clinical course (NSG 405: Community Health Nursing).
- Minimum 40 credit hours of the required prerequisite non-nursing course requirement must be completed prior to admission to RN-BS option
 - Must complete Anatomy and Physiology I & II, Microbiology, General Psychology, General Chemistry, College Algebra, & 6 credit college-level English
 - Please note that six hours of college-level English and three hours of college-level mathematics are UNCW transfer admission requirement
 - All 58 required prerequisite credits must be completed prior to the enrollment in NSG 415 (Nursing Research).

Admission Process of the RN to BSN Program

Step 1. Begin the application process by applying to UNCW (Deadline – March 1, 2010). Your application to the School of Nursing RN to BS Program will not be processed if you have not been admitted to the University. Admission to UNCW is a separate application process through the UNCW Office of Admissions.

- **Fall Semester 2010 deadline is** March 1. After March 1, the office will process your application on a space-available basis only. The University reserves the right to return an application and fee if received after March 1.
- **UNCW Transfer Admission Requirement:** To be Considered for Admission, You Must:
 - Be eligible to return to the last institution attended.
 - Have attained a 2.50 cumulative GPA (on a 4.0 scale) on all transferable work attempted at all institutions attended.
 - Have completed at least 24 semester hours of transferable credit.
 - Have completed six hours of college-level English.
 - Have completed three hours of college-level mathematics
- **When Admitted:** Admitted candidates have until May 1 or 30 days from date of admissions letter (for fall semester) to submit an **enrollment deposit**. The University will cancel your admission if you do not submit an enrollment deposit by the designated deadline.
- **Application:** The office encourages the use of our electronic application. However, a paper (pdf) version is available (click on <http://www.uncw.edu/admissions/apply.html> for UNCW application form)
- You should expect to hear from UNCW regarding your acceptance within 4-8 weeks. If you do not receive any correspondence from the University after that time, email the Admissions Office at admissions@uncw.edu to inquire about your status.
